What is the PDMP?

PDMP is the Nebraska Prescription Drug Monitoring Program

It is a stand-alone medication query platform available to prescribers and their delegates free of charge.

The PDMP alows prescribers and delegates to view their patients' prescriptions to better monitor the care and treatment of their patients.

Why use the PDMP?

Why is Nebraska's PDMP special?

The NE PDMP shows all prescriptions, not just controlled substances.

There are 4,078 prescribers and 1,137 prescriber delegates enrolled to use the PDMP.

Prescribers can designate clinical staff members as delegates to access the NE PDMP on their behalf.

Nebraska Prescription Drug Monitoring Program Registration Process

Step 1: Complete the PDMP Training

Step 2: Complete the PDMP User Access and Training Acknowledgement Form

Step 3: Complete the PDMP Registration

To complete the PDMP training, request PDMP user access, and register for the PDMP, follow this link.

- · Can access other states controlled substance data
- · Workflow integration opportunities
- Now required by Medicaid and Medicare for controlled substances
- The Medicare Inpatient Prospective Payment Systems (MIPS) rule for electronic prescribing requires providers to query the PDMP before prescribing a schedule II, III or IV controlled substance*.
- Nebraska Medicaid regulation title 471 NAC 18 requires a provider to check the PDMP within 7 days prior to issuing a Schedule II controlled substance*.
- Improves patient safety by having more information to make better informed decisions about your patients.
